Q. What is an AAF District 3 AES sponsor?

It provides more than 3,000 college students with "real-world" experience by requiring a strategic advertising/marketing/media campaign for a corporate sponsor. Sixteen schools nationwide, representing each AAF district, are selected to present their campaigns to a panel of industry judges at the AAF National Conference.

In 2012, nine schools competed in the AAF District 3 competition. The University of Virginia represented District 3 at the AAF National Conference in Austin, Texas.

AAF's college-chapter program has over 200 affiliated chapters throughout the United States. The program includes 6,200 undergraduate student members and more than 300 faculty advisers.
